It all began with a beach house, a storm, and a brave pup named Yahtzee. In the fall of 1998, Brian Haverkate gathered fearless singers, who needed no instrumental accompaniment, to form the first group of its kind at Florida State University. Dubbed All-Night Yahtzee, the group held its first concert in the spring of 1999, and thus, a cappella music was born at FSU. Since then, Yahtzee has competed annually in the ICCA, where they have received acclaim and numerous awards over the years. They also perform regularly at other festivals, like SoJam and BOSton Sings!, host a series of concerts and events around campus, and gig throughout the community. They tour Florida every winter and spring, stopping at all their favorite cities and many of their hometowns. They were also featured on the Pop Network docu-series, "Sing It On." Their members come from different places, musical backgrounds, and interests, but blended together, they bring great music, entertainment, and fun to every audience.

The After School Specials! are from the Claremont Colleges, a consortium of liberal arts colleges in the southern California area. Voices in Your Head is an cappella group from the University of Chicago consisting of students whose areas of study vary as widely as their musical tastes. The group strives to push the boundaries of collegiate a cappella by using the human voice in innovative and creative ways. Voices is honored to have advanced to the ICCA Finals in previous years, including in 2017. In addition to Voices' success in competitions, their most recent album, titled *LIGHTS*, won the 2017 Contemporary A Cappella Recording Award (CARA) for Best Mixed Collegiate Album.

Our Judges

JOSHUA S. DUCHAN, Ph.D. is an ethnomusicologist who studies American popular music and culture, and has been involved in the a cappella world for more than a decade. He sang with The University of Pennsylvania Counterparts in college and with the University of Michigan's Amazin' Blue during graduate school, serving twice as the music director and primary arranger for the latter. His arrangements have been nominated for two CARAs and have appeared on two BOCA compliations. Today, Joshua is the Associate Professor of Music and Director of Graduate Studies in Music at Wayne State University in Detroit, where he teaches courses in music history, world music, and ethnomusicology. His articles on a cappella have been published with the Contemporary A Cappella Society of America (CASA), as well as in several academic journals. His book, "Powerful Voices: The Musical and Social World of Collegiate A Cappella," was the first book-length scholarly work to consider collegiate a cappella, exploring its arranging, rehearsal, performance, and recording practices. Joshua's current research focuses on the music of American singer-songwriter. Billy Joel. His book, "Billy Joel: America's Piano Man," was published in 2017 and features interviews he conducted with Joel himself. Outside of teaching, Joshua remains active in the national a cappella scene as an adjudicator, arranger, clinician, and producer. He has been adjudicating at ICCA and ICHSA events since 2004.

ABBEY JANES, a native Texan at heart, sings with and arranges for Duwende. A four-time CARA winner, Duwende has performed at the Java Jazz Festival in Jakarta, the United Nations Ambassadors Ball, and a World AIDS Day Event at the Royal Theatre Carré in Amsterdam. In addition to television appearances on NBC and Fox, Duwende has been a featured performer at several Sundance Film Festivals, and has given a TEDxTalk for Johnson and Johnson. Abbey enjoys being involved as a clinician and judge at scholastic a cappella conferences and competitions and she is the bookkeeper for the Women's A Cappella Association (WACA). While Abbey was a music major at Franklin and Marshall College, she sang in the mixed group, The Poor Richards. She eventually became the music director and ended up marrying the music director from her freshman year!

DIANA GALEANO is a graduate of Florida State University, where she studied music education with an emphasis in secondary choral education. While at FSU, she sang with 2009 ICCA South champions The AcaBelles. Since graduating, she has worked as a high school chorus teacher, served as director at FSU's summer music camps, sang with the Tanglewood Festival Chorus, and currently acts as the assistant director and proud camp mom at A Cappella Academy in Los Angeles. When she's not teaching or taking care of her aca-children, Diana teaches at a cappella festivals, arranges, offers masterclasses to groups in the greater Boston area, and sings with semi-professional groups Sound Off and Blacklight.

ED BOYER is a producer, engineer, and arranger whose credits include the "Pitch Perfect" film series, "Glee," "The Sing-Off," Pentatonix, and Straight No Chaser, among others. In addition to countless CARAs, his work has contributed to six Grammy nominations and three wins, two American Music Awards, two Emmy nominations, 11 Billboard Top 10 albums, 17 Hot 100 Singles, as well as 11 gold and four platinum RIAA-certified records.

LEE STOVALL currently teaches choir for the South Milwaukee school district, where he directs the award-winning a cappella groups, Delta V and The Poprockets. A founding member of the University of Wisconsin-Madison a cappella group Fundamentally Sound, he has been interested in promoting contemporary a cappella education since college, and kept busy arranging and coaching for groups around the world. Lee's work has earned ICCA awards and CARAs, and spots on BOCA and BOHSA compilations. He has attended seminars with The Vocal Company and Vocomotion studios, volunteered for SingStrong Chicago and A Cappella Fest, and judged for Varsity Vocals, CARAs, and the AVAs. Lee has also worked with Camp A Cappella, directing ensembles from the middle school to collegiate levels, and is a board member of A Cappella University. Outside of the contemporary a cappella world, Lee sings with two professional classical ensembles: the Madison Choral Project and Present Music Milwaukee.

Because each group only has 12 minutes to perform, we ask you to keep your applause to an enthusiastic minimum between songs. Please feel welcome to applaud as much as you want after each group has finished its set. There will be a 15-minute intermission. After the final group has performed, our Champion and Runners-Up from last night's ICHSA Finals will entertain you while the scores are tabulated.

Flash photography and video cameras are prohibited during the concert. Phones are allowed as long as the flash is off and you are not disrupting other patrons. Our talented professional photographer, Joe Martinez, will be making high-resolution images available for purchase in a few weeks. Please follow Varsity Vocals on Facebook for updates.
